COMMENTS FROM THE PRESIDENT

To all our ILE friends and neighbors:

A new year generally represents a time of new beginnings. Here, at ILE, it is no different. The year 2009 will present some new challenges to us. The Judge has denied a request by the previous Board to approve their Special Assessment. He ruled that under our Covenants, the only method available to us for raising badly needed money is to increase our annual maintenance fees. We will shortly be asking you to vote to make that happen. We will also be returning to you the Special Assessment monies you have already paid to ILE.

Much of what we have here at ILE is unique and in order to maintain it, we will have to raise funds. If we do not, there is the risk of totally losing some of our amenities which will cause a serious loss of value to our properties.

A good deal of money has been put into the golf course over the past several years to help invigorate it. Now, we need to turn our attention to the clubhouse which has serious roof leaks causing interior problems. The clubhouse is probably the most used of all our amenities. It is where we conduct our meetings, card games are held here, the restaurant is housed there, monthly board meetings take place in the conference room, general meetings are held in the ballroom which also accommodates parties, dances and dinners. Bingo, which returns monies raised to the clubhouse, is also conducted here. And, perhaps most important, all the ILE corporate offices are in this building.

Due to the size of this building, replacing the roof is no small job and there is no way this can be paid for out of our current maintenance fees. The roof is only one problem that needs to be tackled but it is the most serious. So, when you receive our request, we hope that you will vote "YES" to the increase in our maintenance fees which have not seen an increase since 1994!!! Consider this: in 1994, we were paying an average of \$1.10 for a gallon of diesel fuel which operates much of our equipment here. In 2008, the average cost was approximately \$3.74. That is more than triple the price. Minimum wage has increased from \$4.25 to \$7.21 an hour. Insurance costs have skyrocketed here in Florida. A gallon of milk cost a little over a dollar back then and the average cost of a new car was \$12,350. You would have great difficulty trying to run your household today with the income you had in 1994. That is exactly what we are doing here in ILE. We are attempting to maintain what we have with 1994 dollars and that is clearly an impossible task.

There are other amenities in serious disrepair, also, and most everyone is familiar with the condition of our roads. This newly constructed board and the General Manager are determined and committed to do the best with what we have and to be as frugal as possible as we oversee your funds. Many have indicated a desire to donate back to the community monies already paid for the Special Assessment. This one time donation could help us significantly to make some immediate and badly needed repairs. We hope that you, too, will consider this as an option. Needless to say,

everyone is interested in maintaining our amenities because it so severely impacts the value of our lots here. In order to guarantee enough maintenance funds for the future your "YES" vote is necessary. Hopefully, you will agree.

This very dedicated Board is committed to doing the best job possible in representing all of our interests during the coming year and we are looking forward to your help in doing so.

Library News

New Year greetings from the ILE Library volunteers! We have had a busy year that started with the Yacht Club yard sale last January. This was our only fund raiser during the year and it was a great success. Many thanks to the Yacht Club for the use of tables and space; to Tom Thompson, Angie Allen, Kathryn Wunsch and Mary Anne Stone for helping to haul cartons of books and to the many volunteers who helped to sell during the 2 day event. We look forward to another successful sale January 30 & 31, 2009.

We had the Library carpet steam cleaned and it is in very good shape. However, it is 10 years old and will sooner or later need replacing. We have set aside some of the money in our treasury in a "carpet fund" to pay for that eventual replacement. There are also six new, sturdy, comfortable chairs in the main room that are just the right height for working the perpetual jigsaw puzzles that appear on the table.

In the past year the Library has donated funds toward painting the clubhouse and to the Social Committee for the Welcome Back Party. Our volunteers have staffed the Library for the 8 hours each week that we were open. During that time over 1098 patrons visited the Library and they checked out over 2000 books. Behind the scenes, volunteers sorted donations of books, tapes, magazines and puzzles. Several dozen books and tapes were entered into the computer database, labeled and placed into circulation each month. Magazines were kept current and the older ones donated to a nursing home in Lake Wales. Cartons of duplicate paperbacks were sent to troops in Iraq and veterans in the Tampa VA hospital. Several times the "stale" puzzles were bundled up and traded to Nalcrest for different ones.

If it weren't for the volunteers and the donations from residents the Library would cease

to exist. Thank you all so much. Thanks also to the clubhouse staff who clean, repair and keep the garden neat. ILE can be proud of its Library and the people who keep it running!
